Later on in the 285 bracket, [Jayfie Kaschak](#) takes on Truman's Quinton Bryant and beats him 3-2. That sets up a match with Josh Mitchell, Pennsbury's heavy weight. Jayfie is called for stalling earlier in the bout and is winning 3-2. The buzzer sounds ending the bout. The Pennsbury wrestler is in the center of the mat taking of his headgear and the ref raises his green fist and awards Mitchell one point for stalling. WHAT!!! Everyone was shocked. Over a lot of protest the ref holds his ground and the match goes into overtime and [Jayfie](#) loses 5-3. That's just weird. So [Jayfie](#) drops to the Consis and ends up taking on Bryant for the second time. This time he loses to the HST grappler 3-1, but will still travel to Districts as the fourth place finisher.

The 152 pound bout took six periods to reach a conclusion. [Greg Lanctot](#) and Pennsbury's Mark Nicholson took nearly eight minutes to finally determine a winner. The bout was all even after regulation with the score at 1-1. No score in the first period of overtime. [Greg](#) gets an escape in the next period, but Nicholson comes back with an escape in the next. Score tied 2-2. With only seconds to go

Nicholson shoots and is given a takedown as the buzzer sounds and the Pennsbury wrestler takes the 152 championship by a score of 4-2.

We shouldn't do this but, we always expect a great performance out of **Jamie Callender**. Well, no one was disappointed this time either. Jamie, who brought a 29-1 record into the Section Tournament kept that record in tack with three more impressive wins finishing the day 32-1. Neshaminy's Luke Kisselback lasted but 1:35; Michael Bennett from South suffered a 16-1 tech fall in 4:27. In the finals **Jamie** took on Bensalem's Mike Belski and dispatched him in 1:55 to take home the 189 pound crown.
